The Court has also considered the defendants' letter to the Board of Regents dated February 26, 1980. However, in light of our disposition of the case we need not address the defendants' remaining contentions in connection with the preliminary injunction. [2] The defendants urge that the plaintiffs' request for a preliminary injunction is moot in light of the fact that the plaintiffs have now obtained a sufficient number of faculty signatories to the March 7, 1980, Board of Regents meeting to force the defendants to hold a public

meeting. This Court finds no merit in the defendants' argument. The plaintiffs' original request for a public meeting was predicated upon the erroneous theory that the Board of Regents could refuse to convene on March 7 and that a majority of the public at large could force the Board of Regents to convene. That theory was rejected and the Court finds no basis for the defendants' argument that the request for a public meeting should be considered moot. The Court further notes that the defendants were well aware of the plaintiffs' request for a public meeting and chose to proceed in the manner discussed in this order. [3] The Supreme Court's decision in *U.S. v. Spock*, *supra*, was handed down on June 4, 1981. However, in light of the Court's action today the decision is clearly inapposite to the issues raised by the plaintiffs' motion
